

LBBO PARTY





PANTADUS PAS

Instructions:

- 1. Invitations: print out double sided. Address, add a message to the back if desired, and laminate. We've always had the postal people question the ability to cancel the stamp, but I insist that we've always sent them and the post office carries on.
- 2. Raisin boxes: These were made for an Aussie box of raisins, but should work on any box that's roughly the same size. Simply print and cut it out in one piece on the most outside line. Fold on dotted lines around your box of raisins and tape in place. We did not cut slits to put the tabs in.
- 3. Color book: Print out the cover on yellow card stock. Set aside. Print out the remaining 4 pages double sided. Cut on the solid line, stack your pages and place inside the cover. Sew down the middle of the book. Trim pages if needed and fold in half.
- 4. Bag Toppers: Print out and cut around the outside piece. Fold in half and staple to the top of brown bags, plastic bags, or any party bag.
- 5. Bubble Wraps: These were made to fit mini bottles of bubbles that are often found in the party supply area. Simply print on yellow paper and wrap around bubbles and tape in place. We used a bottle of red bubbles and simply removed the factory labels.
- 6. Straw Toppers: We cut these out and taped a yellow straw to the back. Then we used them for a game where children had to transfer a lego with the straw from one cup to another.





Game Suddestions

- 1. Lego Towers: Each child is given one scoop of lego of roughly the same amount. When the word "go" is given children build towers (upward) for two minutes or as long as time permits. The person with the tallest tower is announced the winner.
- 2. Lego Guestimation: Fill two jars of roughly the same size with regular lego bricks and one with duplo bricks.

 Allow everyone to guess how many legos they think are in each jar and announce winners before guests leave.
- 3. Lego Toss: Using 4 different pieces of paper make rings of verrying size with the outer ring being quite large and the inner ring being quite small. Label them from 5, 10, 15, 20 with the inner most ring being 20. Allow each child 5 pieces of lego to toss into the rings. Tally up the points and see who won. This game is best played on a carpeted area and is quite addictive.
- 4. Lego Straw Game: Each player is given a straw and equal amonts of lego (ie 5 pieces each or 6 pieces each of roughly the same size). The legos are placed on the table, floor, or paper plate. Players use the straw to suck up pieces of lego (creating suction not actually sucking legos up the straw) and must keep them on the straw until dropping them into an empty cup or designated spot. First one done is the winner.


- 5. Lego Creationary: This game is a board game that all ready exists. If a budget can't allow for the purchase of the game you could provide children with a tub of lego and some index cards with pictures of items. Things like a car, cat, house, dinosaur, etc. A child would draw a card and make something out of lego. Other players would guess what it is. Choose to play where either players each make i guess each or guesses are mayed within a time limit. Move in a clockwise manner so each child gets a turn to build something.
- 6. Lego Cookie Craft: In advanced make roll out cookies shaped like lego men/ladies. You can do this easily by purchasing a lego cookie cutter. If that's not in your budget you could make squares and rectangle cookies and then small circle cookies to place on top to make them look like lego bricks. Permit children to decorate cookies at the party.
- 7. Lego Relay Race: Divide children into even teams. Provide each team with a small amount of lego in a container, a spoon, and an empty bucket. Decide where children must run from point a to point b. Players must scoop up a spoonful of lego and race from Point A to Point B drop lego in the empty bucket and run back pacing the spoon to the next person in line. The first team to completely move their lego from Point A to Point B is the winner. It's up to you if you choose that a person starts over for spilling lego off the spoon. We often base this on the ages of our guests before making it a rule across the board.
- E. Lego Pinata: If desired you could make a lego pinata by taking a rectangle box and covering it in plain colored paper. Attack the circular cut ends of a plastic cup in the same color for the "dots" on a lego brick. fill as desired and allow children to smash until it breaks open.













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
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
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
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





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






































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
